


Communicating With Parents

Greetings from the Tumuaki

Greetings everyone

We are excited about some fantastic successes in student learning! At the last Board of Trustees' meeting we reported our school wide, student achievement in reading and mathematics over the last twelve months. The results are outstanding and there has been a major upward shift across the school. The results show that our students:

- are well above the national norm (the average across the country) at virtually every year group;
- show improvement compared to previous years;
- have reached most of the very challenging targets the Board set last year;
- are improving in maths achievement from Year 6 to Year 7 and again from Year 7 to Year 8 contrary to the national pattern which shows a big drop in achievement for these groups.
- are achieving at comparable rates whether boys or girls.
- have in some cases not just improved their results but managed to accelerate their achievement beyond the level usually achieved in a year.

These are really exciting results and not achieved without the input of quality professional development from people such as literacy consultant, Murray Gadd, and a huge effort from teachers. Extension Programmes

We are very excited about the new extension programmes in science and maths that have been implemented in response to parent feedback. Teachers used the recommended identification checklist to select the students for the initial groups. These groups will work with the specialist teachers for a certain number of sessions and then new groups will start. That process will continue until all students have had the opportunity to work in the science room in an appropriate programme. Students will continue to participate in exciting science programmes in their classrooms and anyone who joined us for the Junior led assembly last Friday would have seen this in action. The students taught us all about pulleys, levers, machines, inclines and how to persuade a teacher to sit in a wheelbarrow!



Year 7/8 Programmes

Last week we consulted parents of future Year 7/8 students to find out which programmes they valued and which programmes they wanted to change or review. The meeting had to be brought forward so apologies for the short notice and thanks to those who were able to join us and give excellent feedback. A copy of the ideas will be sent home for a final chance to give feedback before we consider the suggestions. We will keep you informed of progress.

Emergency Response

The responses from our community following the earthquakes have been collated. A summary is included in the newsletter and the full report is available on the website. Thank you to Tania Jones (Board of Trustees) for collating the information. We have already picked up some of the suggestions and set up web based communication via cell phones and email so we are not reliant on the power supply or cell towers to make contact with you. The new system will be trialled this week and there is further information about it in this newsletter. The Board of Trustees' Health and Safety Committee is reviewing the school's emergency response policies and procedures. Once completed, a copy of the updated procedures will be made available to you.

Reports

You received a one page student report this term which was an adapted version of the report we usually send home at the end of Term One and which, for obvious reasons, we were not able to complete. Another one page report will be sent home in Week 9, Term 2, to give you information about your child's achievement to date. This information will be used at the parent/teacher/student meetings in week 11 when the teacher will also outline the progress your child is making towards the national standards. Parents will be advised soon on how to book these meetings online. At the end of the year a summative report is provided that shows actual achievement against the national standards.

Parent Responses to the Russley School Web Survey on Earthquakes

The survey was posted on the Russley School website from 23 March 2011 to 8 April 2011 and focus-sed on actions taken on the day of the February 22nd quake and during the weeks the school was closed. The overwhelming theme of the survey responses is one of praise, gratitude and thanks from parents towards the staff of Russley School for their actions both on the day of the February 22 earth-quake, during the shutdown period, and when students returned to school. Comments focus on the calm professionalism of staff and the care shown towards both students and parents. Comments show that parents felt that the emergency situation was handled extremely competently with excellent communication via the School website. The website proved to be an invaluable service for most parents. There are comments offering praise to particular staff members and some offering practical suggestions for future improvements to procedures. Improvement suggestions focus on mass communication with parents, emergency supplies and school expectations of parents' action in an emergency situation. Overall parents felt that their children were well cared for and such is their faith in Russley School and its staff that they have no doubts that they would be safe.
